

Extended Studies 2008 - 2009

The Division of Extended Studies' main functions are the coordination of all non-credit and special activities, both on and off-campus, and the coordination of off-campus credit courses and telecourses. Extended Studies strives to meet the needs of the non-traditional student as well as the needs of business, industry, government, and the public sector. The division offers a variety of camps during the summer, and is also responsible for reserving Southeastern's facilities for off-campus groups.

Accomplishments of Extended Studies during the 2008-2009 academic year include:

- 5,589 students enrolled in academic courses at nine off-campus sites
- 15,891 students enrolled in electronically delivered courses - 715 classes
- 615 students enrolled in non-credit courses resulting in 35.1 CEU's awarded
- 4,436 students participated in Summer Camp Programs
- 35 off-campus groups reserved Southeastern's facilities, attracting over 16,450 visitors to the campus
- 305 workers attended the Incumbent Worker Training Program courses taught by outside vendors
