Safety Tips:

University Police Officers secure buildings and make walkthroughs during the day, after-hours, and on weekends. For our staff and faculty working afterhours or weekends, we ask you to please pull on the door to make sure it locks and the building is secure, as you enter or leave a building. This protects our property and prevents unauthorized persons from gaining access to our buildings.

For our residential students, be mindful not to allow anyone to piggyback on your swipe as you enter the residence halls. The person attempting to enter may not live in your hall, or may not be a student. Also, you should never prop your residence hall doors. This is your home so lock your door when you leave.

For all who have vehicles, remember to lock your doors and keep valuables out of plain sight. Let's keep Southeastern a safe campus for all to enjoy.
