



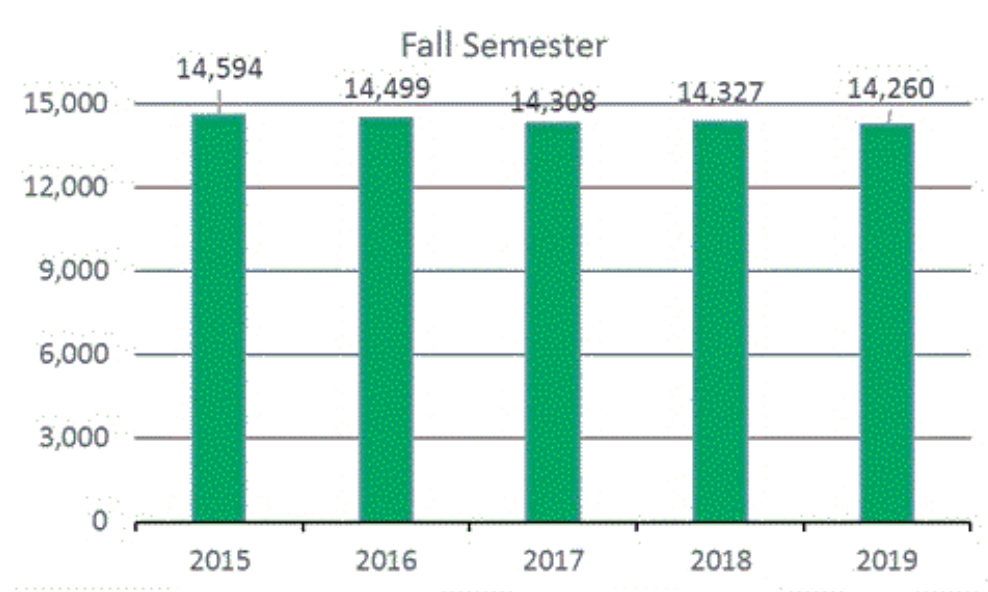
# *Semester Registration Report*

## *Fall 2019*

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### Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 0.5% from the Fall 2018 semester to the Fall 2019 semester. This reflects a 0.5% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 0.3% decrease in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



## Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased to 32.7% of total enrollment compared to 33.0% in Fall 2018.

## Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 11.9 hours which is an increase from 11.8 in Fall 2018. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 7.2 hours, which is an increase from 7.0 in Fall 2018.

The average ACT Composite score increased to 22.8 as compared to 22.5 in Fall 2018.

## Top Six Parishes

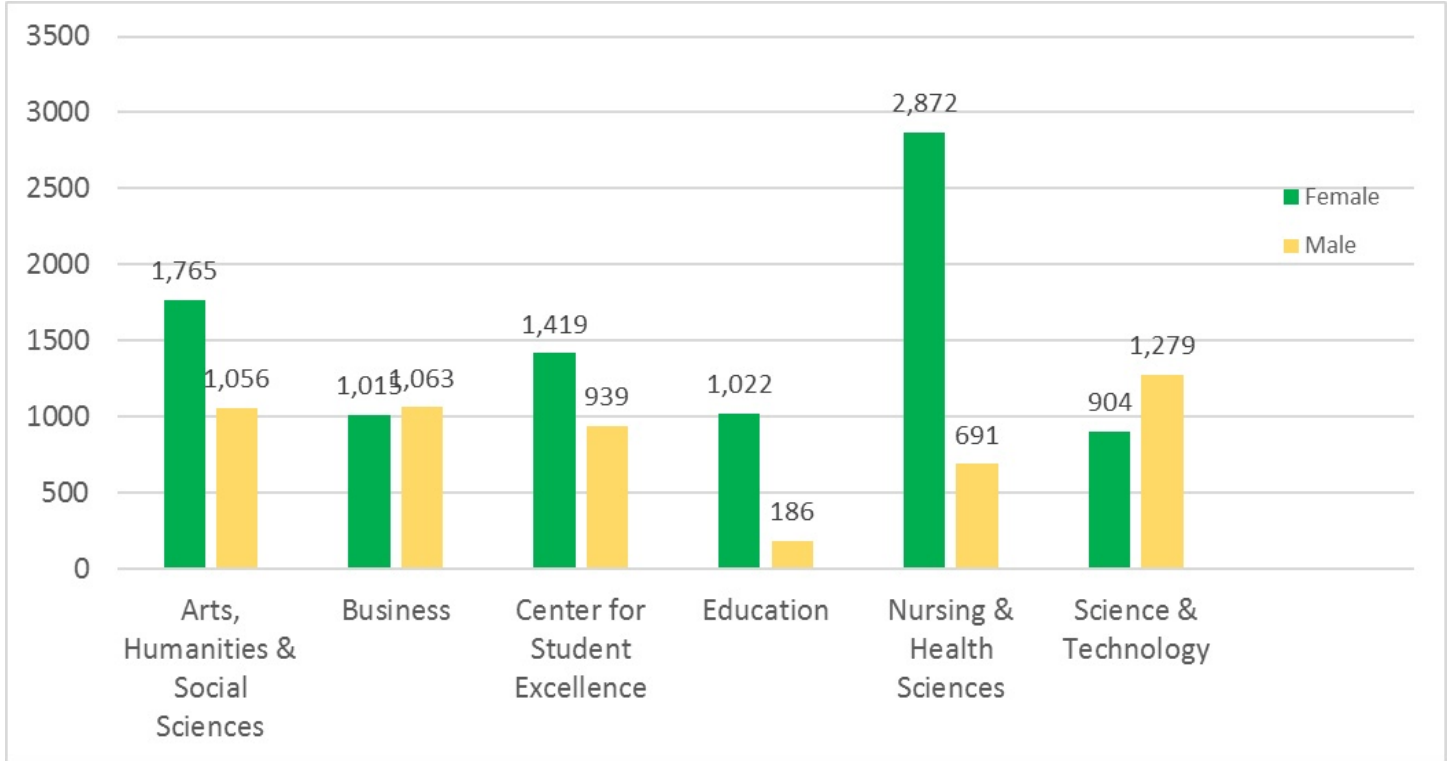
