2019 - 2020 Highlights

- » Honors courses were taught in many areas in 2019-20 including: Art, Biology, Chemistry, Communication, English, History, Humanities, Mathematics, Psychology, and SE 101. Enrollment in fall and spring Honors classes was 18.5% higher in 2019-20 (n=1108) than in 2018-19 (n=935).
- » Fall 2019 enrollment in Honors sections (n=780) was 27% higher than Fall 2018 enrollment (n=614).
- » Seventy-nine students earned Sophomore Honors Distinction for completing 15 hours of Honors courses with no grade lower than a 'B' by the end of their fourth regular semester in 2019-20, a 254% increase over 2018-19.

» Thirteen seniors presented their theses and earned the Honors Diploma in 2019-20. The disciplines in which the theses were completed attest to the breadth of the Honors Program: Biology, Chemistry, Communication, Communication Sciences and Disorders, Computer Science, English, General Studies, History, Kinesiology, Mathematics, Political Science, Psychology, and World Languages were each represented.

» Honors Graduates in 2019-20 were admitted to a number of graduate and professional schools including doctoral programs in Chemistry (Penn State, Purdue, University of Wisconsin, Texas A&M), Southern University Law Center. LSU's Manship School of Communication master's program and Southeastern's graduate programs in Biology and Psychology. The Class of 2019-20 also secured a number of excellent job postings including lead backend engineering for the largest healthcare software provider in the US, political organizing, and speech and occupational therapy.
