



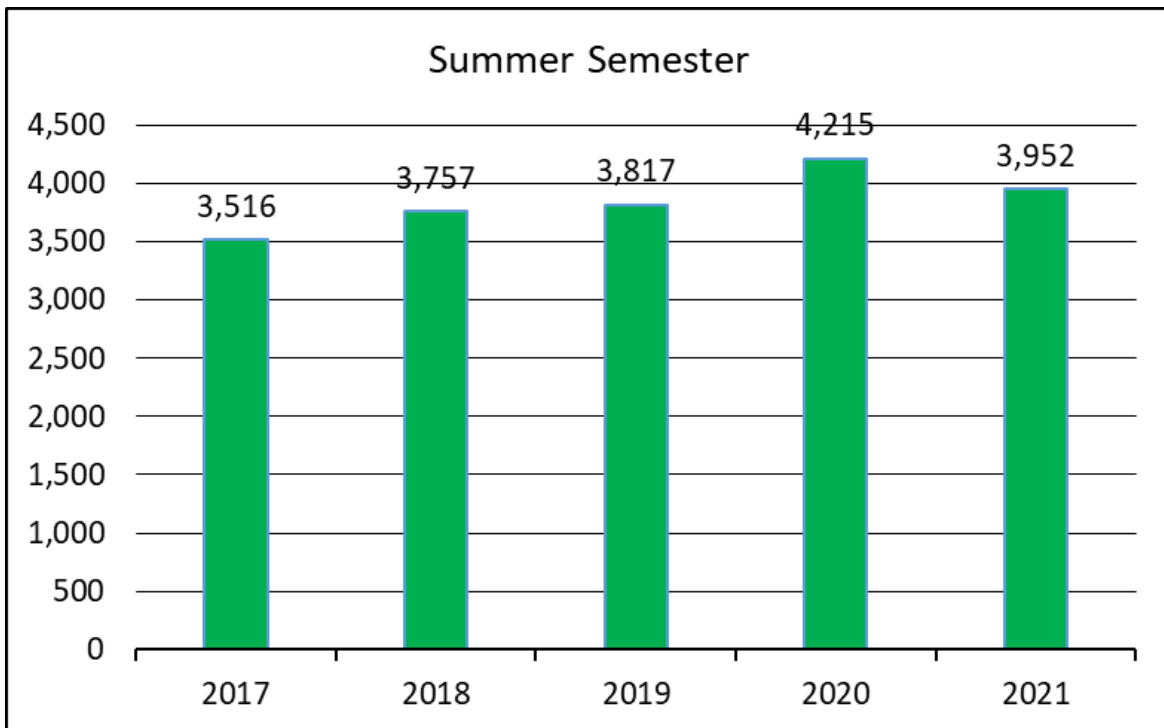
Semester Registration Report

Summer 2021

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Longitudinal Enrollment

Southeastern's total student enrollment decreased by 6.2% from the Summer 2020 semester to the Summer 2021 semester. This reflects a 7.9% decrease in undergraduate enrollment and a 3.1% increase in graduate enrollment. Graduate enrollment includes students in Alternate Certification Programs.



Minority Enrollment

The enrollment of minority students decreased slightly to 33.6% of total enrollment compared to 33.9% in Summer 2020.

Average Course Loads

The average course load of undergraduate students is 5.6 hours, which is slightly lower than Summer 2020's 5.7 average. The average course load for graduate students (including Alternate Certification students, Master's plus 30, and Extended Studies students) is 5.1 hours, which is slightly higher than the 5.0 in Summer 2020. In Summer, a full-time undergraduate student is enrolled in 6 or more hours and full-time graduate students in 4 or more hours. Part-time undergraduate students are enrolled in less than 6 hours and graduate students in less than 4 hours.

Freshmen Cohort ACT Scores

The average ACT Composite score stayed the same from 23.0 in Summer 2020 to 23.0 in Summer 2021.

The number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students taught decreased 6.4% from the Summer 2020 semester to the Summer 2021 semester. (Note: These FTE calculations are based on the undergraduate and graduate hours taught by departments. These calculations will differ from FTE calculations based on the student classification of undergraduate and graduate.) The number of full-time equivalent undergraduate students equals the total undergraduate student credit hour (SCH) production divided by 6, and the number of full-time equivalent graduate equals the total graduate SCH production divided by 4.

Top Six Parishes

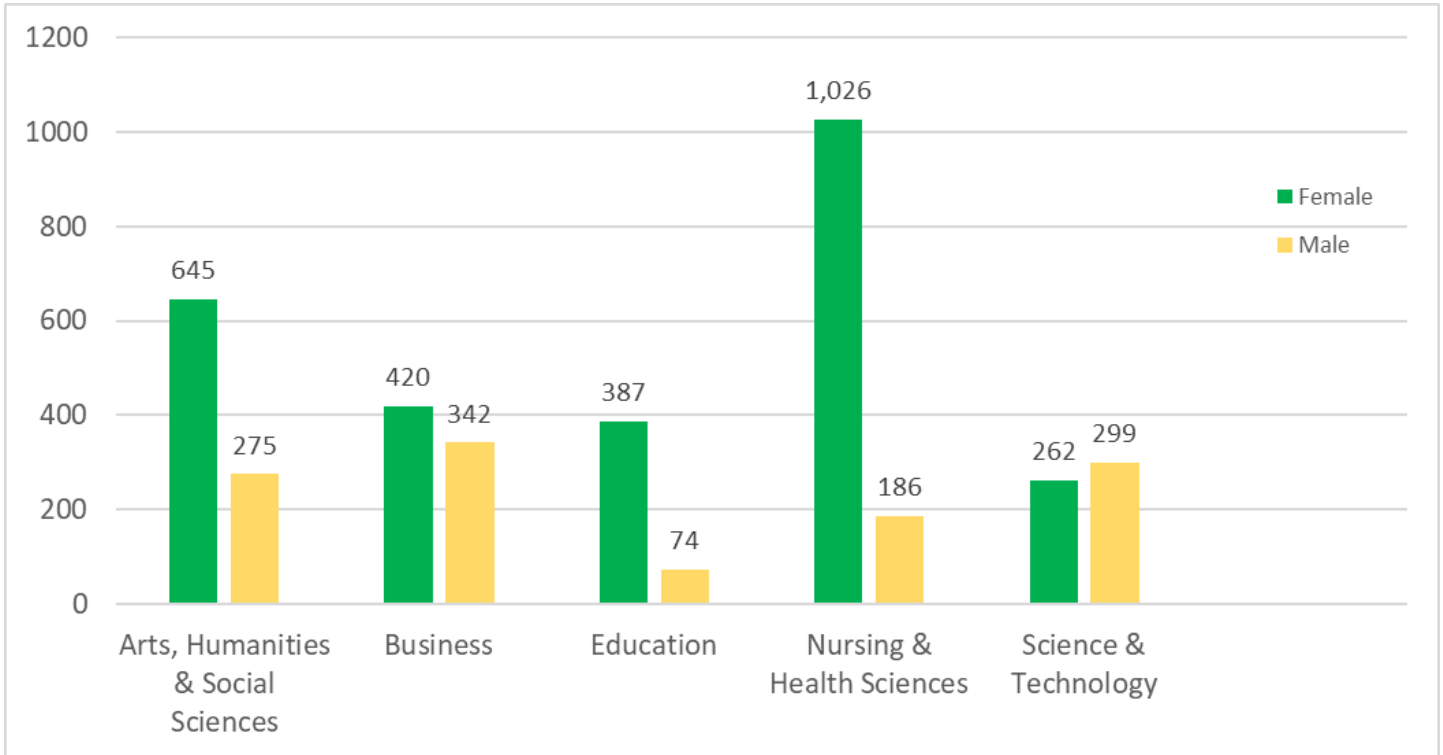
